

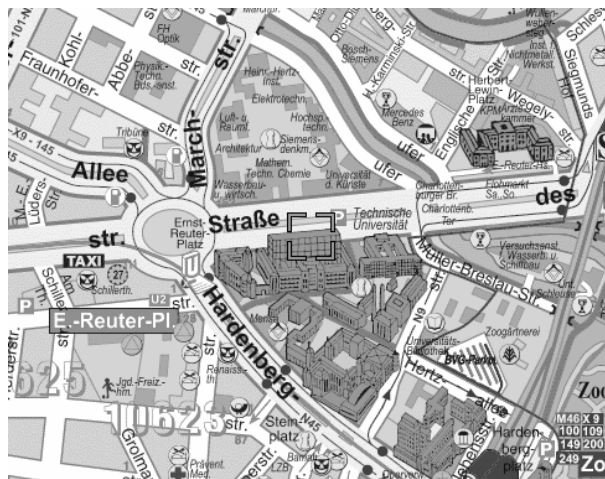
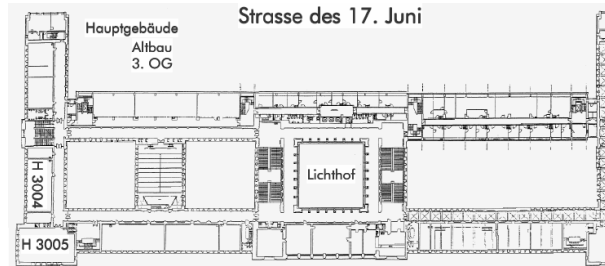

Context

Evaluation of health promoting activities – especially impact, output and outcome evaluation – is a methodologically difficult field. Changes in health and social indicators as well as in behaviour are to be studied and they depend on many determinants of health and other influential factors, including the social, cultural, legal and organisational conditions in which changes are introduced.

Children and young adults are a special target group for health promoting activities, because health promoting activities may influence their health behaviour and attitudes for the rest of their lives.

The seminar will emphasize on two topics:

- Obesity prevention for children and youths
- Smoking prevention programmes (in school)

Aim of the seminar

The seminars aims,

- to describe the status-quo of scientific evaluation studies in health promotion, identify the existing difficulties in designing evaluation of health promoting programs for children and youths and to exchange experiences in the field with special emphasis on different methodological approaches applied,
- to summarize evidence-based knowledge in the field, look upon standards for evaluation of health promotion programs (to qualify them for the inclusion into systematic reviews),
- to compare evaluation research results and methods in Germany to standards for evaluation,
- to develop a methodological guideline for discussion on how to conduct evaluation studies in the field of smoking prevention and prevention of obesity for children and youths.
